

Firefox's Wacky Horizontal Rule Bug

If you're looking at this page in FireFox, you should see rounded edges on the fat lime horizontal rule above.

The CSS is pretty stock.

```
hr {height:30px;background-color:#CC6699;border:3px solid #aa3366; }
```

The only slight peculiarity in the markup is the presence of the 'noshade='noshade' attribute. In fact, 'noshade' by itself is enough to trigger the effect. The 'noshade' attribute is relatively commonly used, but I expect this bug is often ignored because the curves are only visible when the HR is given some extra height.

In some ways it's understandable, in that all "presentation attributes" of the HR element were deprecated in HTML 4.01

Still, you've got to admit, that's a very creative way of responding to a deprecated element.

Let's just think of it as a feature :)
